



- Birds need to nest out of reach of predators.
- Some animals feed on leaves, fruit and/or nuts.
- Strong winds can cause damage to crops and houses.
- Animals sometimes need shelter from extreme heat, cold, wind or rain.
- Animals need safe places to rest and sleep.
- People need fuel to cook and keep warm.
- People need food.
- People need medicines when they are unwell.
- People need land to grow food.
- People like to read, write and paint.
- People need to build homes.
- People need fuel for their cars.
- People need places where they can rest or play.
- Trees and plants take nutrients from the soil. If these nutrients are not replaced, plants won't grow.
- Heavy rainfall can cause flooding.
- Air pollution causes health problems.
- Climate change is caused by increased amounts of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere e.g. carbon dioxide.
- Some insects, fungi and bacteria feed on fallen leaves and branches.
- Some animals eat other animals.
- The amount of freshwater in the world is limited. When rainfall soaks into the ground, that water can be lost to plants and animals for millions of years.
